IN THE KNOW...

Each year Americans recycle more than 87 million tons of recycle products. Not all materials we recycle end up being recycled. Sometimes, valuable recycle materials become ruined or contaminated by getting wet or dirty. These contaminated recycle materials end up in the landfills instead of being recycled. We consumers need to do our part in ensuring we are recycling the right materials and reducing the amount of contamination from entering into the recycle stream. Therefore, "when in doubt, throw it out," is a slogan to remind us to be mindful of only recycling the acceptable recycle materials. We as Americans must reduce the contamination in our recycle totes.

Along with "when in doubt, throw it out," we need to have our recycle materials as "empty, clean and dry" as possible. Try to follow these simple processes when recycling:

Empty. Remove any remaining food or liquid contents from you recyclable item before placing it in a recycling container;

Clean. Lightly rinse the recyclable item to remove any remaining

Dry. Gently shake out excess water or let the recyclable item air dry before placing it in a recycling container.

Soda, Water, & Flavored Beverage Bottles (#1 clear and green plastic resin)



Milk & Juice Jugs, Detergent & Fabric Softener Containers (clear and colored plastic resin)



Narrow Neck Containers such as: health & beauty aid products and household cleaners.



Grocery Containers such as: margarine tubs, frozen desert cups, six and twelve pack rings.



Grocery Containers such as: yogurt cups, and narrow neck syrup and ketchup bottles.



NOT RECYCLABLE - Polystyrene foam food service containers, grocery store meat trays, egg cartons, aspirin bottles, cups, plates and cutlery.



Plastic Buckets, such as kitty litter containers (5 gal-Ion size maximum)
